1. **Welcome Back:** The HSE Staff would like to welcome everyone back. We hope everyone had a fun and relaxing holiday break.
2. **Reminder:** Due to the fact that there will not be any after school clubs this week, dismissal will be extremely busy. In order to keep things running smoothly we ask that parents arrive on time and continue to follow the dismissal plan from the beginning of the year. As a reminder please stay in your vehicle to ensure the most efficient dismissal. Let's work together to keep our children safe.
3. **Spring Clubs:** After School Club registration will be on Tuesday, January 5th and Wednesday, January 6th. A schedule was sent home today with the Monday Mail. It has also been posted on the school's website with the program policy. Parents/students can drop off the registration forms (one for each child) to the front office from 7:30 -9:30am and 2:30 - 4 pm on these days. The forms will be numbered in the order they are received. Students returning to the same club from the fall semester will get priority first. After that, students will be accepted into a club in the order the form has been received. Late registration forms will automatically be put on the waiting list. Payments may be made from 7:30am - 4:30 pm through Friday, January 8<sup>th</sup>. Once payments have been made you will receive a schedule of the clubs your child has been registered for. If no payment has been received, your child will be automatically dropped from the club and the next child on the waiting list will take over this spot. Clubs will run from Jan. 11- April 23, 2010. 3. **Accelerated Reader:** The Accelerated Reader (AR) program at HSE continues to benefit all students. This week all students will take the S.T.A.R. reading test which is used to determine the reading level of each student. Students choose their own books that fall within their determined level and read them at their own pace. Students then take a short quiz on the computer working toward a 6 week goal set by their ELA teacher. Goals will be set by the end of next week. We ask that all parents help support their child by encouraging them to read books at home to help them reach their goal.
4. **Tutoring:** Math, Science, and English tutorials will begin within the next few weeks. A letter will be sent home with more information about the scheduled tutoring classes. Tutoring that has been assigned to a student is considered mandatory. Parents will need to make transportation arrangements for their child. Failure to attend the tutoring sessions will result in Saturday Detention.
5. **Spelling Bee:** This week each 1st-8th grade class will hold their own classroom Spelling Bee. The winners of each class will then advance to the school wide Spelling Bee which will be held on January 15th. Good luck to each and every one of our HSE students.
6. **Fundraiser:** HSE's Schwan's Truckload Fundraiser takes place the first Thursday of every month. Our next delivery is January 7th. You can put in your order now. # Discipline and Guidance Policy for \_\_\_\_\_

Name of Operation

- ◆ Discipline must be:
  - (1) Individualized and consistent for each child;
  - (2) Appropriate to the child's level of understanding; and
  - (3) Directed toward teaching the child acceptable behavior and self-control.
  
- ◆ A caregiver may only use positive methods of discipline and guidance that encourage self-esteem, self-control, and self-direction, which include at least the following:
  - (1) Using praise and encouragement of good behavior instead of focusing only upon unacceptable behavior;
  - (2) Reminding a child of behavior expectations daily by using clear, positive statements;
  - (3) Redirecting behavior using positive statements; and
  - (4) Using brief supervised separation or time out from the group, when appropriate for the child's age and development, which is limited to no more than one minute per year of the child's age.
  
- ◆ There must be no harsh, cruel, or unusual treatment of any child. The following types of discipline and guidance are prohibited:
  - (1) Corporal punishment or threats of corporal punishment;
  - (2) Punishment associated with food, naps, or toilet training;
  - (3) Pinching, shaking, or biting a child;
  - (4) Hitting a child with a hand or instrument;
  - (5) Putting anything in or on a child's mouth;
  - (6) Humiliating, ridiculing, rejecting, or yelling at a child;
  - (7) Subjecting a child to harsh, abusive, or profane language;
  - (8) Placing a child in a locked or dark room, bathroom, or closet with the door closed;and
  - (9) Requiring a child to remain silent or inactive for inappropriately long periods of time for the child's age.
